- 4- New special programs

ACT SYR 161:

This project continued its work in implementing its action plans towards supporting Syrian refugees and needy.

During the reporting period DSPR Jordan networked with the following bodies to implement its activities:

- Women Program Centers in Aqaba, Madaba, Husn, Souf, Jerash, and Talbiah
- Greek Othodox Church in Amman, Aqaba, Ajloun, Husn
- Catholic Church in Husn
- DSPR Vocational Training Centers and clinic
- Khafilat Al Khair- Zarqa, Princess Basma Centers in Balqa, Ghouson Al Rahmah Association in Kerak.

DSPR Jordan also was very active in empowering voluntary teams, train and provide them with needed skills

Parcels Distribution Program:

DSPR Jordan was very active in working with voluntary work teams in all areas of intervention to collect data and prepare beneficiaries lists of Syrian refugees and needy families at the camps and surrounding neighborhood.

During June 2016, DSPR Jordan continued its operation for the holy month of Ramadan that included supporting (2645) Syrian and needy families with (2645) food parcels in (8) governorates where about (15870) individuals benefitted from this campaign.

This campaign helped DSPR directly touching the real needs of refugees and the host communities where DSPR managed to receive around (10000) application for registration in order to get support from Syrian refugees and needy families.

1- Photography Team of ACT For Peace Australia

In continuation for their work last October 2015, Photography team from ACT For Peace- Australia visited DSPR Jordan to produce media coverage of Ramadan campaign that DSPR Jordan conducted that will help supporting food ration challenge campaign in Australia and secure fund to SYR161.

2- Delegation of (27) students from George Mason University of USA they attended a training workshop on evaluation and feedback at Husn Camp. The students interacted with (40) Syrian and Palestinian refugee women and listen to them evaluating the programs that were implemented by DSPR at the camp, and listen to living stories from the ladies about their daily living and their suffering during refuge time.

3- Mr. Omer Rahaman the regional Director of Lutheran World Relief of Baltimore-USA

who showed interest in partnering with DSPR Jordan to implement a program for the relief of Syrian and Palestinian refugees in Jordan. After a week of field visits and meetings with Mr. Omer, a concept document was submitted to LWR and approved for a total amount of \$ (290000). DSPR Jordan also received Rev. Claire Hargreaves and her daughter Jessica United Methodist UK who visited also Talbiah center to follow up their second visit

DSPR Jordan also received Mr. Cafer Orman from LWR who visited DSPR to launch LWR project for Syrian refugees.

Women Empowerment Project through Vocational Training & Health Education-Church of New Zealand

Through this project, DSPR Jordan continued its activities through conducting needs assessment with participation of (200) housewives from Husn, Souf, and Madaba.

The project plan focused on motivating health committees at project locations to start responding immediately to the health issue that fled to the surface which is H1N1 that is threatening Jordanian society

Assistance to Syrian Refugees 2016 Supported by New Zealand Churches and Government

► DSPR Jordan received a grant of (USD 145000) was received from Christian World Service (CWS) New Zealand for one year to:

- Train (1120) Syrian women on programs related to Sexual Gender Based Violence
- ▶ Train (640) Syrian women on programs related to psychosocial support
- Establish (16) children forums for (640) children age of 8-12 years old
- ► Conduct (24) training workshop on promotion of girl's education
- Conduct (4) training courses on "Start Your Own Business" for (100) Syrian women
- ► Distribute (600) food parcels
- ► Distribute (1400) Infants clothes parcels

► Medically Refer (600) Syrian refugee patient for further treatment

DSPR On going Programs

<u>Health</u>

Goal:

Provide and maintain primary health care services to enhance the well being of Palestinian mothers and children

Achievements

- Monthly health awareness session are conducted on several subjects such as Hepatitis & Phthisis, Skin Care, Personal Hygiene, Dental care, Nutrition, Herbals and Health, and Osteoporosis
- 1. Free Medical Days still a good practice that Refugees either Palestinians, Syrians and needy benefited from especially in Gynecology, Pediatric, and General medicine.
- 2. The clinics continued to be active in income generating to cover its operational expenses (100%) Total revenue till the end of October 2016(\$34314).
- 3. Syrian refugees are being medically checked for free at the clinic on average of (100) Syrian refugee women and children monthly
- 4. New –Zealand for Health Education Program officially started for the first year of the project.







Vocational Training

To improve conditions and access to basic education for Palestinians in camps and marginalized areas, while enhancing their competencies and potentials

Achievements

- 1. Girls Vocational Training Center s in the camps is very active center for all activities, that DSPR implement for its regular programs and for SYR 161program.
- 2. Voluntary Women Committee of 10-15 women in each camp is support, facilitating, and conduct DSPR activities.
- 3. Folkloric production remained the main activity of the centers, where its products were sold through bazaars and showrooms.
- 4. New –Zealand project for Vocational Training Program officially started for the second year of the project.
